(*The quack of dawn*)

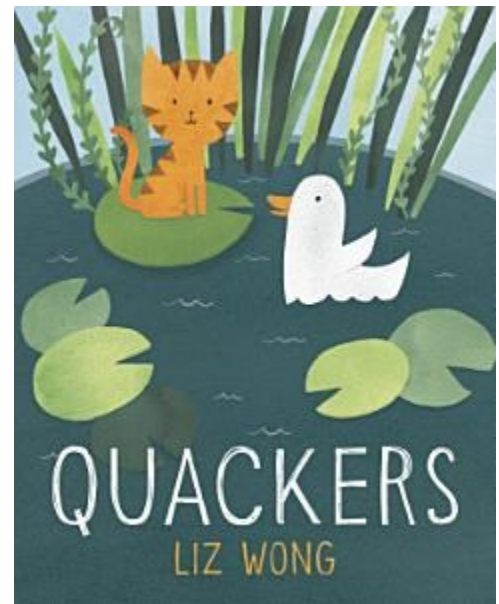
What do you call a duck that steals?

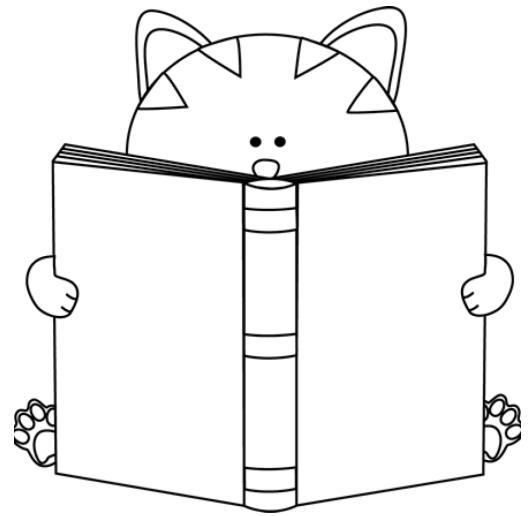
